FOREWORD from ARCs Chairman:

2023 has come to the end of our second year as a non-profit organization and Amanah Relief Center (ARC) must first thank Allah for allowing us to do this important social work for the people here in Indonesia. We also would like to thank all our donors, partners, and team members for allowing us to achieve beyond our set goals; we are extremely grateful and honored to have been given the Amanah to do this work. This second year as a non-profit organization has been just as challenging as our first year, however in different manners - and yet we were still able to achieve more than expected towards the works – here, in Indonesia.

Now that Amanah Relief Center has established our flag on the ground in several Indonesian provinces, we believe that we have achieved more than just from behind the desk and that being on the ground and participating firsthand has allowed us to expand our groundwork and work directly for the people and expanded our outreach to those in need of the proper social provisions and improvements.

To see our category of collected works as a whole, we have compiled Amanah Relief Centers' 2023 Annual Report as a documentation outline of our responsibility and trust to our donors, partners, team members, and future investors with full transparency via this documentation report. We aim – with this effort - to provide transparency and accountability for our actions of our financial programs/campaigns; and by doing so, we hope to continue to expand our footprint in Indonesia which will allow us to gain new donors, supporters, and future investors to support Amanah Relief Center's important and ambitious social-economic works.

As Chairman of Amanah Relief Center, I represent the Board of Trustees, the organization associates, and advisors to deliver the introduction of the 2023 Annual Report to the donors and supporters of ARC. *Firstly,* in our second outing as a young, new organization in Indonesia, Amanah Relief Center has been able to grow and expand our social-economic works throughout other parts of Indonesia - both from our management team and the outreach on the ground. We were able to expand into 19 provinces during our Ramadhan Rice campaign and worked with other individuals and organizations to expand our footprint. Alhamdulillah, we reached more people and, in more villages, while we provided more social improvements, which allowed us to continue to expand in the same area and further.

Secondly, we are grateful that our organization is still doing the work that we have set out to do. It is spearheaded by Akbar, Nurul, and Harris - and supported by the full ARC team members - who are pushing with positive motivation and continual encouragement that keeps ARC going. The full ARC team knows that hundreds and thousands of villagers need social improvements injected into their daily lives, especially since we (ARC) know that there is a rough estimation of over 84,000 villages across Indonesia's archipelago landscape that needs to be addressed with basic, social-economic improvements. That is why ARC is dedicated to expanding and reaching into as many areas as possible each day, each month, and each year to accomplish our mission and vision.

Thirdly, ARC's ground works have expanded not just because of the support and help from our loyal donors and associated contacts but because we believe that we have built a name of reliability to execute and complete the campaigns at hand. This year - 2023, we joined hands with other organizations that have reached out to us - and to some organizations that we have reached out to collaborate, expand our efforts, and extend our footprint in the circle of social-charity works in Indonesia. We worked with 3x NGOs in the USA and 7x Yayasan in Indonesia including five (5) organizations that collaborated and helped during Cianjur's emergency disasters between late 2022 and mid-2023. ARC worked in the capacity of a) raising the funds, b) managing and coordinating the projects/campaigns - domestically and internationally, c) visiting the locations to document and evaluate the situation, and d) performing the actual works on the ground. ARC has grown tremendously because of the collaborations, and we enjoy the (personal) growth within and external growth through the collaboration efforts with the other organizations.

Fourthly, these last two years have been an eye-opener for ARC - to realize that small steps and small works can make a difference in people's lives, especially in far, out-of-reach villages - which have led to bigger steps and bigger impact for those who have never been given a fair opportunity.

In retrospection, ARC started with several small campaigns in the beginning, and after two years - by the end of 2023, we have participated in 27 different types of campaigns that include and not limited to:

- a) social & economic impact for villagers & villages,
- b) providing an assortment of meals & food staples,
- c) building community structures & facilities,
- d) installing an assortment of water wells to benefit field workers & religious institutions,
- e) providing Islamic knowledge & counseling support,
- f) building collaboration among other organizations, and much more.

Alhamdulillah, we have been fortunate to grow steadily and consistently in hopes of being a leading organization in charity work for the people in Indonesia.

Fifthly, our small organization has been very fortunate to assemble, manage, and conduct the people's needs from our home offices and implement the groundwork while expanding across the variety of Indonesian islands; being proactive to achieve ARC's common goals. Included in ARC's expansion via the campaigns, we have also expanded our collaborative efforts with other like-minded organizations - domestically and internationally. These collaborative efforts focused specifically on the emergency disaster of Cianjur earthquake of November 2022, which continued into mid-2023; assembling five (5) organizations to combine the collaborative efforts for the Cianjur survivors and their aftermath situations. We continue to keep the open-door policy to continue international and domestic collaborations to help those in need based on the campaign's target and donations.

And finally, the international pool of donors and supporters has been extremely instrumental in facilitating ARC's footprint throughout Indonesia. Our priorities in attracting donors to Amanah Relief Center are many, however, our primary and main principle is for our donors to earn immeasurable rewards with Allah, the Almighty. To know and understand the meaning of the Quran and Sunnah regarding: 'giving with what you have', where we have some donors who donate large amounts, while others donate what they can, and some donate consistently - as monthly donors. The organization was founded with the overarching goal of alleviating the challenges faced by those in need and catalyzing positive change within communities. With a profound commitment to empathy and a focus on creating a meaningful impact, the organization directs its efforts toward a range of charitable initiatives.

ORGANIZATION PROFILE & TEAM:

This category comprises four distinct campaigns aimed at addressing food insecurity and related projects.

A total of five campaigns fall under this theme, focusing on initiatives that contribute to community development at both national and international levels.

This category involves two campaigns specifically dedicated to providing relief and aid in response to natural disasters.

Among the eleven campaigns conducted throughout the year 2023, four campaigns have notably garnered significant support, both in terms of donations and impact on the targeted communities. These standout campaigns are as follows:

Qurbani Campaign

In 2023, ARC was able to raise Qurbani funds to provide eight (8) goats and three (3) cows during the celebration of Eidul Adha. The goats are usually focused on feeding villages in Central Java, while the cows are for those in Maluku, specifically feeding Islamic boarding schools.

ARCs focus on helping these specific locations due to the poor conditions of the villages. In Central Java, most of the villagers only get to eat meat once a year – which is by your Qurbani donations. While in Maluku, these villages and Islamic boarding schools are home to the very poor and orphaned, and where villages as a whole have reverted to Islam – up to 100 families accepting Islam per village. NOTE: It is said that 29 villages have accepted Islam since the 80s, in a location that was prone to religious intolerance.

Public Toilet Campaign

While ARC was building bridges, our team discovered that there were several villages with about 100 families that still used the local stream as a bathroom. After some research and discovery, ARC realized that only 40% of the villages had access to bathrooms. So, ARC raised awareness & money, and then designed and built three sets of MCKs which are 3-doors - each with a toilet and space to shower as a public toilet facility. This also included - on the outside wall - a two (or three)-faucet wudu facility area. This has improved their cleanliness for their community and as a human being.

Among the eleven campaigns conducted throughout the year 2023, four campaigns have notably garnered significant support, both in terms of donations and impact on the targeted communities. These standout campaigns are as follows:


Ramadhan Rice Campaign

ARCs Ramadhan Rice campaign is our way of giving back to those during a time of hunger; where statistically, over 18 million people go to bed hungry every night in Indonesia. We know that rice is the staple food for the people of Indonesia and we have chosen for the last three (3) years to provide 11 pounds (5 kilos) of rice sacks to be delivered to the poor, widowed, orphaned, and Islamic boarding schools during the month of Ramadhan.

On our first outing, we were able to distribute 300 bags of rice Alhamdulillah. Last year – 2023 – for our second outing, we were able to deliver 977 bags of rice, which was 5 tonnes of rice to nineteen (19) different provinces throughout Indonesia. We were blessed to have the extended team members and other organizations on the ground and working tirelessly to help disperse the sacks of Rice to the needy.

Natural Disaster Relief for Cianjur Earthquake – Emergency Disaster


Our Emergency disaster response to the Cianjur earthquake in late 2022 was immediate from our organization. Alhamdulillah, ARC coordinated a joint effort and collaborated with five (5) NGOs to provide and set up three (3), separate - five (5) door MCK with wudu facilities, and two (2) semi-permanent, 150-person musollah in the heavily stricken earthquake areas. This included raising funds, managing the projects, coordinating the teams, and on-the-ground assessments & works.
